

## Large Crochet Flower

There's a flower called Never Ending Wild Flower by [littlemonkeys crochet.com](http://littlemonkeys crochet.com)

This tutorial here covers the first three rows of petals.

The petals go in the front loops, the increase in back loops of the same stitches.

There are always 12 petals per round.

Abbreviations:

St: Stitch





Sl st: Slip Stitch



Sc: Single crochet

dc: Double crochet

tr: treble

	<p>12 dc into magic ring. Finish with sl st.</p>		<p>First round of petals (front loops only): Sl st to first front loop of 1<sup>st</sup> stitch: *Into same st: Ch2, 2 dc, ch2, sl st. Sl st to next st*.</p>

	<p>First round of increase (back loop only): Fold the petals towards you little. Ch 1, sl st into 1<sup>st</sup> loop. Into each back loop: 2 dc.</p>		<p>Second row of petals (front loops only): Sl st to first front link of 1<sup>st</sup> st. *Ch 2, 1 dc, dc in next st, dc in same st, ch 2, sl st in same st, sl st to next st.*.</p>

	<p>Done with 2<sup>nd</sup> row.  Second row of increase (back loops only):  Fold the petals towards you again.  Ch 1, sl st to 1<sup>st</sup> back loop.  *2 dc in 1<sup>st</sup> st, 1 dc in next st*</p>		<p>For the last row of petals you can use front and back loops.  Sl st to first dc. * Ch 2, dc in same st, 2 tr in next st, 1 dc in next st, ch 2, sl st in same st.  Sl st to next st*.</p>
